### Christ the King

When celebrating the Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe, it should not be our version of a playground brag - "Oh yeah? Well, my Jesus is King of the Universe!" Today's Gospel reminds us that there is no such structure in this world for anyone to reign over.

Much of sacred scripture was written during persecution, so we could expect occasional claims that Jesus ruled over the persecutors. But political power is also not the point. Somehow in the depts of the universe there is a divine structure. Jesus is king because the universe is in harmony with his life, teaching and sacrifice.

In St. Peter's Square, the central obelisk, which is topped by a cross, is surrounded by eight stones, each depicting a wind from a different direction. Beyond that, moving out from the cross of Christ, is a line along which are depicted constellations, the signs of the Zodiac. This functions as a solar calendar but, more importantly, it reminds us that the cross is the centre of the world and all that is. This is the everlasting dominion of which Daniel speaks.

Today, therefore, we give thanks that Jesus has been revealed to us, that we need not fight a futile battle against the universe. Jesus is King. Let us rejoice. (Reflection by Glenn Byer, from Living with Christ.)

Dear Parishioners:

As announced two weeks ago, St. Edward's Parish is joining with all other parishes in launching the Family of Faith Campaign, initiated by Cardinal Collins; the campaign will address critical priorities that will benefit Catholics all across the Archdiocese.

The Family of Faith Campaign will help our parish, too. For every dollar raised, our parish will receive 25 cents. If we exceed our goal, we will keep 75 per cent of every dollar over goal.

As you know, the priorities for our parish will be to invest in youth and young adult ministry, ministry to those in senior years, renewing and initiating ministries to persons of all ages, and of course to do some critical upgrades to our church interior and to re-pave the parking lot.

Parishioners will be invited over the next few weeks to consider a financial "pledge", which can be offered over the course of 5 years or less. Our parish goal is \$535,000 (of which 25%, or \$133,750, would come back to the parish). Obviously, if we go over goal, the return on over-goal amounts is 75 cents per dollar.

I am pleased to announce that, so far, through personal meetings and general announcements, we have raised over \$300,000 towards our goal of \$535,000, from parishioners who offered early pledges! This is wonderful news, and I am very inspired and deeply grateful for this generous sign of support.

As Pastor, I would not ask parishioners to pledge if I were not to pledge. I, along with many priests of the Archdiocese, will join our parish communities in offering a pledge as well. I shall be pledging \$10,000 to the campaign (\$2,000 per year for 5 years). This invitation to consider a pledge is open to all and I ask you to prayerfully consider your own personal gift.

As announced at Mass, last week, brochures and pledge forms will be mailed to parishioners. You can

either mail back the form, drop it at the parish office, or bring with you on the weekend when attending Mass. For those unable, at this time to contribute, please pray for the success of the campaign and for all the needs that the campaign wishes to address. My thanks to all who asked to volunteer.
