Nativity of the Lord

MOTH-LIKE, I AM instinctively attracted to light. My inner child is enchanted by the kaleidoscope of colours displayed in Christmas neighbourhoods, by twinkling fireflies on a summer evening, or by festive fireworks displays. My spirit is soothed by candle glow and firelight, by shimmering moonbeams on new snow, by dappled sunlight through the trees. On a practical level, I am thankful for flashlights and lanterns to light my way during a power blackout. Light is an essential, uplifting and transformative element in our lives.

The Nativity readings glow with images of light. Isaiah proclaims: "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light." Psalm 97 exults in the light that will "shine on us this day." John's Gospel, too, speaks of a light shining in the darkness, "and the darkness did not overcome it." What we celebrate today is Jesus as the radiance of God bursting forth into our darkened world.

But it is not enough for us to be merely passive recipients of that light. We are called to become, each of us, a light for others. Often the darkness surrounding us may seem to be impenetrable. Alone, we each may be only a tiny firefly of a wavering candle flame. Joined together in the light of Christ, however, we can illuminate and transform our world.
