5th Sunday of Lent

The foundation of Jesus' ministry is expressed in his statement to the crowd – and to us. "Let anyone among you who is without sin be the first to throw a stone at her." Jesus knows, as surely as we do when we are humble and honest with ourselves, that all of us have acted badly in our relationships – with others and with creation – and will do so again. However, we can fall into the trap of continually assessing how badly we have acted and then comparing ourselves to others. This comparison inevitably leads either to self-congratulation and harsh judgment of others or to self-loathing and being victimized ourselves.

Neither leads us to becoming a more compassionate person, and compassion is what we are called to. When compassion replaces judgement and self-loathing, we are no longer as concerned with fairness. We are freed up to attend to the true purpose of the spiritual life: contemplate and appreciate the beautiful mystery of simply being alive.

Rather than looking at one another and judging ourselves, we will become a commnity standing in awe before the majesty and mystery of life. The spiritual life is not about rules and consequences or excluding those who are different than ourselves; the spiritual life can be found in divesting ourselves of whatever prevents us from appreciating creation in all its splendour and diversity.
