Resurrection of the Lord

People may say to others, sometimes unkindly, "Get a life!" But there may be truth for us in this advice. We can feel weary, trapped in a rut. Easter joy and the compassionate presence of the resurrected Jesus can seem far away.

For Christians, "getting a life" means finding our meaning and "centre" in God's great love and peace, and then acting from the wisdom and generosity of spirit that comes of this communion. It was in their deep desolation that Jesus appeared to his friends. God is with us always, but when we lack hope and things seem at their worst, we may best be able to perceive God's presence. However, we need to choose to find moments of quiet attentiveness. It was Mary, who stayed in the garden, who met the "gardener" Jesus.

To help us understand the profound significance of Easter, today's liturgy associates Jesus with the paschal lamb sacrificed at Passover. The lamb enabled the Hebrews to flee slavery. Jewish people tell this ancient event annually, reminding themselves that it is as if each of them also journeys from slavery into freedom. Besides pointing to how deeply our Christian faith is rooted in Judaism, the image reminds us that we too can choose to leave our slavery. Let us give thanks for this choice offered us on this glorious day! (*Reflection of Beth Porter. from Living with Christ*)




Tiny Shroud Ministry
