14th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In Mel Gibson's much talked-about movie of a few years back, *The Passion of the Christ*, a scene that struck me as particularly poignant sees Jesus fall, be crushed by the cross and then whipped, prompting Mary to run to help him, saying "I'm here." Jesus holds Mary's face and says to her, "See, Mother, I make all things new." I feel the power of those words, especially in Mary's pain of losing her son and in Jesus' suffering.

In today's gospel, Jesus sends out the seventy, like lambs into the midst of wolves, and calls them to leave their material goods behind and bring peace everywhere they go.

Jesus' name is so powerful that even the demons submit to the seventy when they call on his name. Today, Jesus is also calling us to go out in faith and bring his peace and love to everyone we meet. He has given us authority to tread on whatever snakes and scorpions we encounter, and over all the power of the enemy, whoever they may be; nothing will hurt us. This authority should prompt us to say, as Mary does, "I'm here."

The readings in today's Mass give us much to rejoice about. How could we not boast in the cross of our Lord? Our names are written in heaven!

Dear Parishioners:

Since we will have only one parish bulletin for July (and one for August), I would just like to update you on some projects currently underway in the parish.

As you know, we are moving forward with plans to repave the parking lot and possibly upgrade the outdoor lighting in the parking lot.

To re-pave a parking lot is not a simple task. First, we had to do an investigation of the soil and the places where deterioration has occurred. Secondly, the drains had to be scoped and investigated to ensure there would be no surprises when work begins. A company also had to come in to mark all utility spots on the overall property. This week a surveying company will come in to survey the whole property and to then clearly outline all the boundry points that impact our church property.

Electrical studies will also be done with respect to the lighting in the parking lot. As you can imagine, all this study takes time, but I am pleased to report the work is progressing well. All of these reports will be crucial as we plan out the actual re-paving of the parking lot.

I wish to thank Dan Christante, the Property Manager hired to oversee this project. Dan will continue to provide us updates over the summer.

I also commissioned a Building and Site Study, as we look forward to other work being planned (as outlined in the Family of Faith Campaign).

Secondly, we are planning a Summer Picnic for all parishioners on Sunday, August 7th (tentative date). The Social Committee will keep the parish informed and announcements will be made during the coming weeks.

Finally, I invite your prayers for our upcoming Summer Camp, the week of July 16th. I am very grateful to Rosanna Del Grosso, our parish co-ordinator for the Summer Camp, as well as to all the volunteers who will assist us. I also wish to thank our seminarian, Rob Rosales, for helping us to get this exciting program off and running. It will be our first time hosting it and so we are looking forward to it.
