32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

THE SADDUCEES REJECTED resurrection because it was not in the Pentateuch, the only books they considered Scripture. They tried to discredit Jesus through a Leviticus law requiring that if a man without children died, his brother would marry the widow and their first son would be considered the dead man's son. But what if the second brother died childless, and a third, up to seventh brother? Which of the seven would be her husband when they rose from the dead? Surely the idea of resurrection was problematic.

But Jesus rejected their premise. Resurrected life was not the same as our pre-resurrection life. The Resurrection transforms us into a different state of being, where things like marriage no longer occur. Jesus also addressed their view that resurrection was not in the Torah. In Exodus, God spoke to Moses as the God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, all of whom were long dead by Moses' time. But God is the God of the living, so those three must still be alive in some way.

Jesus himself is the basis for our own resurrection. He lived a human life like each of us and, just as we will, he died. But he rose from the dead three days later. This is the central mystery we celebrate in the Eucharist, and our hope for the future. (*Reflection of John McLaughlin. from Living with Christ*)
