John the Baptist had been sent to prepare the way for Jesus, the Saviour. John anticipated the coming of a messiah and he was confident that Jesus was the messiah. So, why the lingering doubts? Jesus didn't really fit with John's preconceived notion of a messiah who would come breathing fire and brimstone and take the unsuspecting and unrepentant world by storm.

It's time that we too shifted our focus from unrealistic expectation to embrace the promise of Jesus as the true meaning of Christmas.
