I HEARD AN expert on poetry remark recently that poetry is language that mirrors the soul. Jesus must have understood this, for he almost always turned to the language of poetry to convey to his listeners what was most important for them to understand: he is the gate of the sheepfold; he is the source of living water; he is the vine and they the branches – and in today's gospel, he says that to follow him it is essential to eat His body and drink His blood.

Jesus longs to convey to us just how profoundly we must remain in his love if we are going to understand his ministry and find strength to live out joyfully our own calling to be God's presence of loving compassion in our broken world. In the Eucharist, we are invited to grasp the depth of the love of God for us and for our world, and to unite our own joy and pain with those of Christ.

Usually we receive the Eucharist with others. The Eucharist is a call to community. Together we draw strength and offer thanks, trusting in the wisdom of Pope Francis who has reminded us that the Eucharist is not "a prize for the perfect but...nourishment for the weak." The Church parking lot has now re-opened following weeks of extensive work that included complete removal of the old soil (due to heavy salt content), repair to drainage pipes, and the placement of special underground grids to firm up the new soil and asphalt. A second layer of asphalt was applied this past week as well as the painting of new lines and accessible pathways and parking.

The front of the Church was also excavated for similar reasons as the rear parking lot. In addition, the driveway was improved to allow for easier access as well as to provide more adequate drop-off points for those needing assistance.

While the main part of the construction is over, we still have to complete the installation of our new (LED) light poles, as well as new lighting around the Church and Rectory. Irrigation and landscaping will also be improved over the next few weeks. Thank you for your support and patience during this time of construction. We will keep you informed.

Daily Mass will now return to the Church, from the school, starting this Monday, June 19th, at 8:30 a.m. Our thanks to Rocchina Leone, the Principal of St. Cyril School, and to Anthony De Ciantis, maintenance supervisor, for their support and welcome during the time of construction.
