Epiphany of the Lord

"ARISE, SHINE, FOR your light has come," Isaiah says. He calls us to know God's presence. God's light on us, around us, and commands us to spread that light.

Isaiah tells the people of Israel that the light of God's blessing shines on them and beyond them. He sees nations streaming to them, attracted by God's light. Some Israelites thought God's favour was exclusively theirs. But God's light can be shared without diminishing it.

Every year at Easter the paschal candle, the Light of Christ, comes into a dark church and light is shared so the whole church glows. We proclaim light divided but never dimmed.

Epiphany celebrates God's light being revealed to all nations. The gospel, Paul says, has spread to the Gentiles. They have seen and received the Light of Christ. Matthew tells of even earlier Gentile observers of that light, the Magi: "We observed his star at its rising, and have come to pay him homage."

The light that shone on the Magi shines on us. Jesus shares his light with us and asks us to spread it. The light of our faith may seem fragile, but a small light can set the world on fire. Sharing the light of God's love, God's blessing does not diminish it – it grows in strength as it is shared. Let's keep it burning brightly!
