This past Thursday night, we held a Prayer Service at St. Edward's for the victims of the Toronto attack, attended by Faith leaders of other churches in the Yonge-Finch neighbourhood. I sent out an invitation to all parishioners. This weekend, we will also offer special prayers at Mass for all impacted by this tragedy.

What follows below is a statement from Cardinal Thomas Collins:

"I invite the Catholic community across the Archdiocese of Toronto to join me in offering our prayers for all those who were killed or injured in the violent incident earlier today. I will be asking all 225 Catholic churches in the Archdiocese of Toronto to offer special prayer intentions this week for all those who have suffered. Let us unite our efforts to bring comfort and care to those who are hurting today." (April 24, 2018)
