25th Sunday in Ordinary Time

CHRISTIANITY IS OFTEN castigated for teaching that God is an angry God whose wrath at human sin required a perfect human sacrifice to appease his bad temper. And we can even admit that some Christians do misrepresent the gospel in this way. But today's readings tell a different story.

It is not God who demands the death of the innocent, but us. The reading from Wisdom lays bare the human response to innocence. It can make us uncomfortable. And so, when God comes to us as an innocent man, we cannot bear his presence and we crucify him.

In the letter of James, and in today's Gospel, we see the human dynamics that underlie our propensity to sacrifice the innocent. But we also see Christ's answer to those dynamics. If we are not to be people who sacrifice the innocent, we must be, as James says "peaceable, gentle, willing to yield, full of mercy and good fruits, without a trace of partiality or hypocrisy," or, as Jesus says, "Whoever wants to be first must be last of all and servant of all."

The sacrifice we offer at Mass today, then, is not an innocent victim presented to an angry God, but a loving victim who offered himself to God precisely by offering himself to us, even as we "condemned him to a shameful death." (*Reflection by Brett Salkeld, from Living with Christ*)
