WHAT DOES IT mean to serve God? In today's Gospel, the dishonest manager has taken his position for granted. He has been using what belongs to the master to enrich himself and has been caught. Even more than the loss of his stewardship, he fears becoming an outcast. So he for once deals honestly with his neighbours, charging them only what they owe and not extra to line his own pockets. He thus regains his master's favour.

In this story, the master is God and we are the managers of his property. God is the opposite of a self-interested master. His unfathomable love for us means that he dedicates himself to our well-being, showering us with gifts to help us to have the ultimate gift, an eternal home with him in heaven. Heaven is not guaranteed; we, like the manager, will have to account for the way we have used God's gifts.

However, we see in the parable that the manager is forgiven the moment he puts his master first, never mind all of the times he ignored him. It is not too late to make sure that we are serving the master we wish to serve. To serve God faithfully with the gifts he has given us means doing our utmost to emulate his selfless, merciful love.
