33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

IMAGES OF STRIFE and the temple being destroyed are terrifying but familiar. The images in today's readings remind us that we live in an in-between time.

In the second reading, Saint Paul calls us to live our waiting with commitment by turning away from idleness and by imitating the kingdom for which we wait, a kingdom the psalmist says is just, equitable and joyful. Jesus encourages us to trust God more fully, for He will give us words and wisdom so we may witness to His love.

In 2016, at the end of the Jubilee Year of Mercy, Pope Francis named the 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time the World Day of the Poor. The Pope entreats the faithful to reach out in solidarity to those most in need. This calls us to live our waiting with commitment, stepping out of certainties and comforts, and entering vulnerability.

As we approach Advent, we ask for the grace to be fully present with love and compassion to the suffering of our time. By doing so, we prepare our hearts to receive God's love born as an infant messiah. Jesus reminds us not to be "led astray" or "to prepare your defense in advance." Our lives lived in faithful witness to the kingdom that is to come become a sign of joy and hope for today.
