Christ the King

EARLY IN HIS papacy, Pope Francis used a striking image to describe the kind of leadership priests should exercise in their faith communities. He urged them to be shepherds marked by "the smell of the sheep." A similar image appears in today's first reading, where God names King David as the "shepherd of my people Israel." The reading from Colossians describes the supreme authority of Christ over all things. Yet throughout His earthly ministry, Jesus modelled servant leadership, which we could also call "shepherd leadership."

The daily news often shows a different style of leadership, characterized by arrogance, greed, hunger for power and a disregard for the common good. The kind of leadership suggested in today's readings, by contrast, is marked by service, humility and compassion. As the taunting onlookers in the Gospel scene mock the kingship of Jesus, we get a glimpse into the heart of true leadership. In the interaction between the crucified Jesus and the "good thief," we see an example of a humble petitioner – "Jesus, remember me..." – receiving not judgment but forgiveness: "Today you will be with me in Paradise."

Today we seek the grace to practice and to encourage, through our prayers and our actions, the kind of shepherd leadership modelled by Jesus.
