3rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

WE HEAR TODAY the simple narrative of Jesus calling His first disciples. Simon and Andrew, James and John are invited to follow Him and "immediately" they leave their nets and their boats to join Jesus in His mission. How was it possible that these mature men, responsible to their work and families, heard an invitation from a stranger and walked away from their means of livelihood, from the familiar pattern of their lives, from the daily rhythm of the early morning pushing-off the boats in search of what the sea would yield up to them?

Perhaps they had already heard of Jesus, but Matthew gives us no indication of that. Rather, we are presented with the stark immediacy of their response, which points to a remarkable and spontaneous moment of commitment. They were ready. God's grace, already at work in them, and their response to that grace, had prepared them for this moment.

The calling of these four men might seem a remarkable and unique event, but perhaps it is the same call that comes to us. Again and again Jesus says to each of us, "Follow me." By God's grace we too can respond with a complete gift of self, again and again giving our "yes" to His invitation to let ourselves be loved and to bring His love to others.
