3rd Sunday of Lent

I ONCE DID a day hike in a desert-like landscape on a hot day in July. By noon, I had no water left in my water bottle. I began to experience an increasingly painful thirst. My throat was parched. My whole body was crying for water while the desert sun kept beating down on me.

The desert can be an image for a period of suffering that we experience in our lives. We can feel so drained, so tired of pain, so distressed. We thirst for some relief, for a better time. We languish.

The Samaritan woman was thirsty. Not just for water but mainly for a better life. She meets Jesus who offered her hope. In fact. He makes a promise to her: "The one who drinks of the water that I will give will never be thirsty." This sounds too good to be true. But Jesus insists by saying that He is offering her life in all its fullness. She believes in Him and her life is transformed.

Jesus invites us today to follow Him more closely. As the Psalm says, "O that today you would listen to the voice of the Lord." By listening to His infinitely merciful and caring voice, we can bring to Him the parched and hurting parts of our lives and be transformed.

Message from the Archdiocese Re: Coronavirus for Parish and Staff

Our goal is to act responsibly, based on credible information from reliable sources. We have been in regular contact with local health officials and will continue this dialogue. Information from the provincial website (<u>Ontario.ca/COVID-19</u>) provides basic background and practical advice.

At this time Cardinal Collins is requesting that all parishes implement the following measures on a temporary basis:

- At the Sign of Peace, refrain from shaking hands a simple bow, nod or "Peace be with you" to your neighbour is appropriate.
- For parishes offering communion under both species, forgo the distribution of the Precious Blood from the chalice for the congregation at this time.
- Parishes should continue to ensure that those distributing communion wash their hands or use hand sanitizer before and after the distribution of communion.

There are everyday actions that can help prevent the spread of germs that cause respiratory illnesses. Take these everyday steps to reduce exposure to the virus and protect your health:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water or alcohol-based hand sanitizer
- Sneeze and cough into your sleeve
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose or mouth
- Avoid contact with people who are sick
- Stay home if you are sick

Legislation that would expand access to euthanasia in our country has been introduced by the federal government. Among the alarming changes are amendments to expand euthanasia to those without a terminal illness, including those with disabilities.
