3rd Sunday of Easter

A FRIEND AND I once loaded a lawnmower into the back of a station wagon and had it roll, punching its handle right through the rear glass. It was memorable not only for the street spectacle we caused but for our different perspectives on the event. My friend said, "I can't believe that happened! Can you?" "Yes." "How?" "A minute ago, there was a window back there and now there insn't. See? My hand goes through."

Sometimes we are helped to believe because we use our bodies and senses as a way of knowing. Cooks taste their creations. Liturgical rites use practices that help us literally "incorporate" faith, to profess our belief with the body as well as the heart and mind. There are times too when we need to be given permission or tools to explore other ways of arriving at awareness. Teachers regularly use physical objets to facilitate understanding abstract concepts.

Epecially when faced with something that might seem improbable or unlikely and yet appears undeniable according to what is in front of us, it is good that we have access to different ways of knowing or believing. All the more so when it has to do with faith. The desire of God that we believe is accompanied by seemingly limitless creative mind, heart, body, approaches. What a generosity of love.
