4th Sunday of Advent

"BLESSED IS SHE who believed that there would be a fulfillment of what was spoken to her by the Lord."

It's easy to forget how difficult it was for Mary to accept God's plan. To be found pregnant out of wedlock was not only a source of shame, but against Levitical law. It could mean her death – a painful death by stoning. Still, Our Lady trusted in the Lord whom she loved and gave her *fiat* – let it be done.

In today's Gospel, we see the first fruits of that trust. In the early days of her pregnancy, when Mary arrived at her cousin Elizabeth's home, she must have wondered how Elizabeth would react. Maybe Mary would be able to conceal her pregnancy for a few months...Mary had no reason to believe that she and her child would be met with anything other than condemnation. Yet, the moment she arrived, Elizabeth greeted her with love, already knowing of the pregnancy and congratulating Mary for her faith.

Even in times of danger, Mary consistently submitted herself to the will of God. She trusted in Him. In return, God cared for her. Although she endured suffering throughout her life, she was always provided for by the God of love. We too can put our trust in God, because He cares for us. Advent Preparation for Christmas 2021

Each week, as of Sunday, 21 November 2021, the Solemnity of Christ the King, the CCCB will release a video recording of a Bishop reflecting on the Gospel Reading for each Sunday of Advent. This year's reflections were inspired by Indigenous Delegation travelling to Rome to meet with Pope Francis from 17-20 December 2021. Each reflection is based one of the five essential stages of reconciliation: examen, confession, repentance, reparation (making amends), and reconciliation. It is likewise hoped these reflections will assist the faithful, Indigenous and non-Indigenous alike, in preparing for Pope Francis' eventual apostolic journey to Canada. The videos were developed under the auspices of the Bishops Working Group on Coordinating Indigenous Initiatives, with the script being approved by the same, as agreed to by the Executive Committee at its Special Meeting on 12 November 2021.
