1st Sunday of Lent

"BORN WITH A silver spoon in his mouth." That's how Satan saw Jesus – as a man whose divine nature gave Him power and privilege without limit. Satan calculated that if he could entice Jesus into abusing that power and privilege, he could prove that it was Satan who was the powerful one. But that was a serious miscalculation, because for Jesus, power meant nothing outside His work in service to God.

When I reflect, I realize that I lead a privileged life. For many people, myself included, the very fact of our education, social status, age, gender, race or even our religion affords us a different experience of life from other people in our world. The temptation offered to us is, as it was for Jesus in the desert, to take that privilege for granted or to abuse any power we have to gain an edge on others.

In Lent, the Church offers us an opportunity to realize what privilege or power we enjoy; to examine how we are using or abusing it; and to make changes that put God first. In today's celebration, let us thank God for this chance to do a reset, to realize that all is gift and that God's gifts are to be used in the service of God and others. *Reflection of Margaret Bick from Living With Christ*)

Traditional Lenten Disciplines

Penance: Lent is a time for penance and repentance, for almsgiving and prayer, for working to change attitudes that are not pleasing to God.

Fasting & Abstinence: Catholics aged 14 and older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. In addition, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics from age 18 – 59 fast, limiting theselves to one full meal and two smaller measl each day.

Prayer: Catholics are encouraged to pray more during Lent, especially with Scripture. Lent is also an ideal time to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for the celebration of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Almsgiving: Moved by the sacrifice of Christ, many Christians combine almsgiving with fasting, giving to the poor the money they saved by eaing, drinking or buying less as they rely more upon God's abundant grace.
