ON THE EVENING of Palm Sunday two years ago, my elderly mother called to tell me that she felt very unwell. Over the next weeks she suffered her own "passion" until her death on Mother's Day. We are each assigned our own passion, our own "Way of the Cross" in one way or another.

Today's readings gives us a practice run through the passion drama(s) of our own lives in the company of Jesus. At the beginning of Mass we are invited to take up our palms and join in the procession of the ages – to celebrate all that is good, with overflowing faithfulness and spontaneous joy. Then we are plunged into the depths of Jesus' Passion. The long Gospel narrative underscores the steps of His suffering and our own: final moments of fellowship, then solitude, and finally the heartache and injustice of a life suddenly cut short by death. But this story is meant to encourage us as we enter into Holy Week (and all weeks that are "holy"); in the end, Jesus rises from the dead and gifts us with life and the Holy Spirit.

As we receive Jesus in Holy Communion today, let us recall that we are receiving our Redeemer's own strength to endure all sufferings and to rise again with him in Easter glory. (*Reflection of Beverly Illaug from Living with Christ*)

Dear Parishioners:

The situation in Ukraine is obviously very distressing for many. I have been thinking about how we might further utilize Holy Week as a time of prayer and solidarity for those in the Ukraine and others in need.

I suggest we look to Holy Thursday for some inspiration. We are reminded, at the Last Supper, that Jesus, knowing He was to begin His Passion, instituted for us the Sacrament of the Eucharist, in which He is present to us in His Body and Blood. However, He also instructed us, in the example of His Washing of the Feet, that true discipleship in Him involves serving one another, as He came to serve and not to be served.

Given that the Church allows, on Holy Thursday, for a collection to be taken up for the poor and those in need, I would like to suggest that we take up a collection this Holy Thursday in support of Humanitarian Aid for the Ukraine. Envelopes are available in the church lobby or you can bring your own. I thank those who have already donated.

Secondly, for those wishing to support a more local need, churches of various faiths are coming together to support the North York Food Bank through gifts of non-perishable food items. You may bring these items to the specially marked bin in the church lobby on Holy Thursday, or even drop them off in the bins located at Scotiabank Empress Walk, 5075 Yonge Street. Items needed include: cereal, pasta sauce, hearty soups, red kidney beans, jam and Nut butter, instant noodles, gluten-free food, female hygiene & baby supplies, and toiletries.

I trust these projects will endeavour to make our Holy Week more centered in our faith and service to our brothers and sisters in need. Thank you!
