1st Sunday of Lent

GENEALOGIES ARE POPULAR, as websites and test kits abound. I have not ventured into this world, but some of my cousins have. I am grateful for the grainy black and white photos that pop up in my inbox every few months.

Is it a notion of family and heritage that Moses is appealing to in today's first reading? If it is, the story is not always as glamorous as we may want it to be. The promise of "milk and honey" in today's first reading is sometimes a travelling companion to our psalm response of "when I am in trouble." Paul reminds us to remain rooted in the word, on our lips and in our heart. Yes, look back so we can move forward, but do not miss today.

This First Sunday of Lent calls us to remember God's blessings, knowing the hardships that are ours as well. Jesus himself was not immune to temptation and neither are we. Even when rooted in His baptism and His ancestors, Jesus was tempted. And the attractions may be familiar to us, coming as our desire for provision, position and power. Times and places may differ, but temptations find us.

May this Lenten season be a time of reclaiming our traditions so that when temped, we can resolutely call out the name of the Lord and be saved.

Traditional Lenten Disciplines

Penance: Lent is a time for penance and repentance, for almsgiving and prayer, for working to change attitudes that are not pleasing to God.

Fasting & Abstinence: Catholics aged 14 and older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. In addition, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics from age 18 – 59 fast, limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals each day.

Prayer: Catholics are encouraged to pray more during Lent, especially with Scripture. Lent is also an ideal time to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for the celebration of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Almsgiving: Moved by the sacrifice of Christ, many Christians combine almsgiving with fasting, giving to the poor the money saved by less eating, or shopping. Consider donations to ShareLife or the St. Vincent de Paul Society who serve the poor and needy.

These encounters serve as a vessel for a deep renewal in our relationships with our spouses, selves and God.
