3rd Sunday of Lent

156 - 3

IN TODAY'S GOSPEL, Jesus speaks of the importance of repentance. Interrogators approach Jesus to tell Him about a massacre of Galileans, looking for Him to react and to give an opinion on such a violent event. We can imagine the torture and cruelty that the Galilean people experienced under Pilate's ruthless rule. Asked if it is because of sin that they suffered in this way, Jesus reminds those questioning Him that we are all sinners. He then refers to a tragic accident, a source of gossip at the time. Victims of such tragedies are no greater sinners than anyone else in their communities. Rather than condemn the Romans or shame sinners, Jesus points to repentance.

It is in our human nature to look for the reason bad things happen to people. Life is fragile, death is a reality and we have a need to be in right relationship with our God. Suffering is not reserved for the sinner and repentance is necessary for everyone.

We believe in a merciful and compassionate God who gives us time for growth. This Lenten season is a good time to dig around the foundation of our lives and fertilize where it is needed. In this Eucharistic celebration, we pray with hearts open, repentant and mindful of our need for God's love. (Reflection of Jan Bentham of Living with Christ)

Traditional Lenten Disciplines

Penance: Lent is a time for penance and repentance, for almsgiving and prayer, for working to change attitudes that are not pleasing to God.

Fasting & Abstinence: Catholics aged 14 and older abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday, Good Friday and all the Fridays of Lent. In addition, on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, Catholics from age 18 – 59 fast, limiting themselves to one full meal and two smaller meals each day.

Prayer: Catholics are encouraged to pray more during Lent, especially with Scripture. Lent is also an ideal time to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation in preparation for the celebration of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection.

Almsgiving: Moved by the sacrifice of Christ, many Christians combine almsgiving with fasting, giving to the poor the money saved by less eating, or shopping. Consider donations to ShareLife or the St. Vincent de Paul Society who serve the poor and needy.
