A reading from the Gospel according to Matthew 2:1-12

When Jesus was born in Bethlehem of Judaea. The magi came from the east

When they arrived in Jerusalem, they asked the people,

"Where is the newborn King of the Jews?

And they gave him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh.

That night, God told the magi in a dream not to go back to Herod. So they went back to their own country by another way.
